



Creating Clarity Bountiful

True confession: I was stuck. I didn't know what to write about this month's topic, bountiful. As the days went by and the deadline for this newsletter loomed, the only

bountifulness in my life seemed to be my dispirited feelings about writing this article! However, the more I thought about my vision of 'bountiful', the more curious I became about how others define the idea. So I devised a very unscientific experiment, and asked some friends: "What comes to mind when you hear the word *bountiful*?"

The responses were both predictable, and surprising. As had I, people easily came up with words to describe bountiful: Ample; richness; plenty; prolific; luxuriant; generous; lavish; abundance. What surprised me was that just like me, simply thinking of the word elicited a physical and emotional effect in each of the participants. Every person physically softened and relaxed, then became optimistic and hopeful as they pondered their ideas of bountifulness.

How is it that our visions of bountifulness transport us to a place of abundance and hope? Science has shown that envisioning positive thoughts affects several areas of the brain, and chemicals including endorphins and dopamine are released. What we experience internally and externally is a softening, happiness, and optimism.

Anyone can experience bountifulness; these four steps will take you there:

Define

Each of us has our own definition of bountiful. Think about yours. What comes to mind? Involve your senses: What does bountiful look like? Taste like? Feel like? Sound like? Smell like? Tap into your bountiful imagination to create your own definition.

Stop

Design daily breaks to slow down to take in the bountifulness already in your life, whether it's 5 seconds or 15 minutes.

Look

As you pause to notice what is already bountiful in your life, allow your senses to experience what is around you. What abundance is in your world right now?

Appreciate

Enjoy the bountifulness around you! Perhaps you see a swarm of bees gathering pollen in your garden, or are holding your hands under a stream of warm water gushing from the kitchen faucet. Enjoy the buzz and activity; luxuriate in the feel of warm water flowing over your hands.

As my unscientific study proved, envisioning and sensing bountifulness in your life can shift your outlook from scarcity and fear to one of hope and plenty. When you feel bountiful, you live from a sense of abundance rather than a sense of lack. Experiencing your vision of bountiful can change your world.

There's so much negative news that draws our attention. It's not about ignoring what's going on in the world. We still

take appropriate actions. It's about our default, our baseline of attention, the half-full or the half-empty cup?

Science is showing us that experiencing the fullness and bounty of life, makes connections and dopamine in the brain, and results in happier people with increased attention, enthusiasm, energy, and creativity.

I remember a story in the book *Happiness for No Reason* by Marcie Shimoff. An elderly man in the Bahamas, who lived in gratitude for all that he had in life, passed it on. He daily went to a roundabout and waved to people as they drove to work. They said that he reminded them to feel good, open their hearts, and have a great day.

I have an app that signals me to briefly check in about what I'm thinking. It gives me the opportunity to sometimes refocus into more ease and fullness. Other actions that help make this switch include:

Each day writing 3 things for which you are grateful.

Being in nature

Moments of self-comfort, for example, a hand on the heart with a memory of kindness.

Happiness and feeling bountiful is an inside-out job. Today, what is the richness in your cup? How do you share the bounty?



Any dog owner in the world can participate in the on-line Animal Ownership Interaction Study by anonymously completing an initial survey of about 93 questions. Every six months Study participants may be asked to answer additional questions. The Study will run for two years.

A final goal of the Study will be to publish the findings in high impact scientific journals, particularly the ones that support open-access publishing, such as PLoS One and Preventive Veterinary Medicine, and to disseminate globally their findings to animal welfare organizations, veterinarians, and animal professionals in training and behavior.

Fall Changes in the Home

We tend to forget to change the décor in our homes, other than decorate for holidays, when fall comes upon us. We diligently put our gardens to bed for the season, and rarely give a second thought about switching lightweight summer textiles and décor, and putting them into storage. Making a few simple changes to the interiors and decorating with textiles in bold, deep colors reminisce of fall will have your home ready to appreciate the bounty of the season.

- Replace light textured and color decorative pillows and throws with bold, heavyweight and deeper colors. You'll relish cozying up with a good book and cup of tea.





A C O O O O 's Dog Treats



Method:

- 1. Preheat oven to 350° F.
- 2. Mix the pumpkin puree, chopped dried apple pieces. Wait to add the chicken broth or water.
- 3. Mix dry ingredients in a large bowl. Stir in the pumpkin puree & apple slices add in small amount of the liquid, as needed.
- 4. Mix all ingredients until thoroughly combined, then mix with hands. Add more liquid or flour, if needed. Divide into 4 balls.

Roll out dough ball between parchment paper, 1/8" consistent thickness in rectangular shape to fit baking sheet. Discard top parchment paper & save for next baking tray. Use pizza cuter to cut dough in parallel strips to create a checkerboard of 1" squares. Use a ruler to help cut straight lines. This technique makes the process super fast. Don't move the squares—leave them in place on the parchment paper and place on baking sheet.

Bake 35 minutes, slightly brown. Remove from oven, remove parchment paper and cool. This recipe uses 4 baking sheet/trays. These treats are chewy because of the dried apples & are very tasty. Recipe makes enough treats to fill a 3 quart storage container. Keep small amount of treats at room temperature in an airtight container for up to 1 week & the remaining in an airtight container in the refrigerator for up to 4 weeks.

Pumpkin Apple Treats

Ingredients:

- 1 cup of chopped dried apple
- 1 can (15oz) pumpkin (not pie filling)
- ½ cup of chicken broth (low sodium) or water
- 2 ½ cups of flour (you can use any flour)
- ½ wheat germ
- 1 cup rolled oats, uncooked
- ¹/₂ cup pumpkin seeds chopped
- 1 tablespoon cinnamon

*Parchment paper & rolling pin for rolling out the dough, Pizza cutter, Ruler for cutting straight lines & a dog to snoopervise.
